Recycling

Harris Corporation seeks first to reduce, recycle, and reuse waste associated with our operations, but when that isn't feasible, we emphasize responsible waste management. Harris sites continually find new ways to follow and promote these principles, and in 2018, Harris recycled 29 percent of our 1,046,436 pounds of hazardous waste and 34 percent of our 3,826,509 pounds of non-hazardous waste. Our dedicated efforts to increasing recycling percentages in both areas are ongoing.
