

Goal 4: Prevent Lung Cancer from Environmental Exposure

LUNG CANCER PREVENTION

Objective

Decrease the percent of current <u>adult</u> <u>smokers</u> by 4 percentage points




Tobacco Cessation Strategies

- 1. Advocate for smoking cessation as part of employee orientation. PSE
- 2. Integrate current cessation aid/resources and assisted referrals (text to quit, online quit coach, websites) into cessation programming
- 3. Promote multi-component interventions that include counseling and Nicotine Replacement Therapy (NRT) in the adult population, including older adults and cancer survivors.
- 4. Reduce client out of pocket expenses by securing comprehensive cessation coverage for private/public insurance and Medicaid. **PSE**
- 5. Increase tobacco cessation by educating providers on all quit smoking products.

Radon Abatement Strategies

- 1. Increase awareness of the effects of radon as it relates to lung cancer
- 2. Promote proven techniques to reduce exposure to radon by seeking sponsors to fund low- income radon mitigation and testing. **PSE**
- Increase community access to radon testing by developing local programs to test and mitigate low income housing through private and public partnerships and home inspection agencies
- 4. Reduce exposure to radon in new or existing construction by embedding radon risk reduction in state and local building codes. **PSE**
- 5. Increase the capacity of health care providers and staff to ask about radon testing in the patient's home and provide educational and testing resources. **PSE**
- 6. Increase testing in non-real estate transactions by promoting radon awareness to medical, public health and childcare communities.

PA Radon Division- Re-entrainment

- Re-entrainment Study Contract with Brad Turk What affect does ground level exhaust have on reentrainment back into the building?
 - Advantages of ground level exhaust
 - Less visual impact
 - Greater operating efficiency and effectiveness
 - Increased fan operating life
 - Lower cost for installation
 - Less risk to installer than when installing tall pipes



PA Radon Division-Re-entrainment

- 10 Homes selected in Harrisburg area
- Systems installed by 2 local mitigators
- Data collection, analysis, and entry every 2 weeks by radon staff- very time consuming



PA Radon Division- High Homes

- Open House March 2019
 - 25 people attend
 - New mitigator Integra, Tony Domingues
 - Discuss ambient monitors
 - May 2019 placed 17 ambient OSL and AT around neighborhood

3 new homes built



PA Radon Division- Regs

- Update of Chapter 240 Radon Certification Regulations
 - Final January 24, 2019
 - First major update since 1991.
 - Codify items that were previously incorporated by reference.
 - Staff working on updating Cert booklet, inspection checklists
 - New hardcopy Regulations sent out May 2019



PA Radon Division- Ambient Radon Study

- For PA study- Capstone/ Masters work with student from University of Penn-- placed duplicate Radonova (ATD) and duplicate Optically Stimulated Luminescence (OSL) detectors in 62 PA counties, mostly in state parks.
- 55 State Parks- Due Dec. 2018
- 19 PA DEP staff and/or friends- Due Dec. 2018
- Report to Follow- still in progress
